PROPER PROCEDURE FOR MAKING A RAILROAD GRADE CROSSING STOP

- 1. SLOW DOWN UPON APPROACH.
- ACTIVATE HAZARD LIGHTS AT LEAST 100 FEET FROM THE GRADE CROSSING.
- 3. COME TO A COMPLETE STOP NO LESS THAN
 15 FEET NOR MORE THAN 50 FEET FROM THE
 GRADE CROSSING MARKER (STOP SIGN, BLACK
 AND WHITE X SHAPEO CROSSDUCK, ETC.) IF YOU
 ARE UNABLE TO GET A CLEAR VIEW IN EITHER
 DIRECTION AFTER THE INITIAL STOP HAS BEEN
 MADE, YOU MAY THEN MOVE UP TO A POINT
 (NOT ON THE TRACK) WHERE YOU MAY ASCERTAIN
 THAT NO TRAIN IS APPROACHING.
- LISTEN AND LOOK IN BOTH DIRECTIONS FOR TRAINS.
 OPEN YOUR FRONT DOOR IF IT IMPROVES YOUR ABILITY TO SEE OR HEAR AN APPROACHING TRAIN.
- 5. PROCEED ONLY IF THE TRACK IS CLEAR, THE ARMS ARE UP AND THE SIGNALS ARE OFF.

SAFETY TIPS



NEVER RACE A TRAIN TO A CROSSING.

NEVER GO AROUND LOWERED GATES.

NEVER RAISE LOWERED GATES.

NEVER HAVE ANYONE ELSE RAISE LOWERED GATES.

DON'T MISJUDGE THE SPEED AND DISTANCE OF AN ONCOMING TRAIN.

TRAINS CAN'T STOP, YOU CAN!

DON'T GET TRAPPED ON THE TRACKS.





IF ITS A TIE, YOU LOSE.

IT IS ILLEGAL TO DO SO (CALL THE DISPATCHER).

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DUE TO THEIR LARGE SIZE, TRAINS OFTEN SEEM TO BE MOVING MORE SLOWLY.

TRAINS CAN TAKE UP TO 1 1/2 MILES TO STOP.

DON'T CROSS UNLESS YOU WILL CLEAR THE TRACKS.





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
